- Copy of passport (identity page)
- A motivation letter where your career prospect will be mentioned (1 page);
- A passport size photo;
- Copy of academic notes (official document) for Bachelor 3, and Master 1 (at least semester 1) degrees;
- Copy of English language certification: TOEFL/TOEIC/IELTS test results if available, Certificate of English as medium of instruction, or Europass Language Passport;
- Two original recommendation letters signed and stamped from professors of Master 1. The recommendation letter should include: i) a final recommendation (strong support/support) and ii) the rank of the candidate in the corresponding unit (the three first/the first half/the second half of the class).

The deadline for application depends on your situation (country of residence, diploma):

- **Students with Campus France Procedure: March 15th**
- **Students not preparing/holding a French Degree: April 28th**
- **Students preparing/holding a French Degree: June 16th**
